

Activities at home for Lambs

Our topic for the month of March is: Favourite stories and characters.

The areas we will be covering are:

- Role play Dressing up as favourite book characters and role playing familiar stories.
- Using the song box to sing favourite songs and rhymes and learn new ones.
- Bring in favourite stories from home to share World book day 7th
- Drawing and writing activities based on favourite books and favourite characters.
- Join in with repeated refrains when listening to familiar stories.
- Use the Fairy box/Explorer box & story stones to create stories.
- Telling own versions of favourite stories changing endings/characters.
- Retelling familiar stories using 'before, after and then'.
- Identifying opposites within stories ie big/little, happy/sad.
- Small world play and puppet play based on favourite stories.
- Reading stories that rhyme and using musical instruments when rhyming.
- Talk about our feelings through characters/puppets.
- Holi 25th Hindu festival of colour.
- Mother's day 10th different cultures traditions for Mother's day.
- St David's day and St Patrick's day crafts.
- Easter crafts and Easter party Wednesday 20th March 2024.

Books, rhymes and songs:

- Using the song boxes in each room to choose favourite songs/rhymes.
- Favourite stories We're Going on a Bear Hunt, The Gruffalo, The Tiger Who Came to Tea,
 The Very Hungry Caterpillar, Driving my Tractor, Dear Zoo, Harry and the Bucketful of
 Dinosaurs (story boxes available to borrow), Zog and Zog and the Flying Doctors,
 Stickman, Harry and the Bucketful of Dinosaurs.
- Traditional tales Goldilocks and the 3 Bears, 3 Billy Goat's Gruff, 3 Little Pigs, Little Red Riding Hood, The Gingerbread Man, The Enormous Turnip (story boxes available to borrow).
- Favourite fairy tales.

Ideas how to explore this topic at home or when you are out and about:

- Read and draw pictures of your favourite stories/characters.

Activities at home for Hedgehogs

Our topic for the month of March is: Small world, stories and rhymes

The areas we will be covering are:

- Join in with repeated refrains when listening to familiar stories.
- Small world themed tuff trays to explore.

- Reading stories 1:1 and in groups.
- Story sack/box circle times.
- Mother's day 10th different cultures traditions for Mother's day.

Books, rhymes and songs:

- Classic nursery rhymes Incy Wincy, Jack & Jill, Humpty Dumpty etc..
- Nursery rhyme story boxes 5 little ducks, 5 little monkeys, 5 speckled frogs, 5 Little Men in a Flying Saucer (available to borrow).
- Using the song boxes in each room to choose favourite songs/rhymes.
- We're Going on a Bear Hunt/ The Gruffalo story boxes available to borrow.
- The Tiger Who Came to Tea (story).
- Traditional tales Goldilocks and the 3 Bears, 3 Billy Goat's Gruff, 3 Little Pigs, Little Red Riding Hood, The Gingerbread Man, The Enormous Turnip (story boxes available to borrow).
- Favourite fairy tales.
